Winchester's 5th Grade Musical – 2019/2020

<u>Opening</u>-

Stage Manager #1: Hello, everybody! Welcome to our 5th grade concert!

Stage Manager #6: (interrupting #1 & trying to get the crowd riled up & excited) Hello NORTHVILLE! How ya doing? Are you ready to rock it out??!!

Stage Manager #2: Excuse me, what are you doing?

Stage Manager #6: I'm trying to get everyone pumped up for the rock show.

Stage Manager #4: A rock show? Cool! Can I help?

Stage Manager #6: Sure! Come on, everybody put your hands in the air! (#5 - #8 put their hands up in the air & try to get the audience to do so)

Stage Manager #5: Let's hear it for the 5th Graders!! Whoo - Whoo ...

Stage Manager #3: Guys, what's going on?

Stage Manager #4: Whadda ya mean, what's going on? We're getting the crowd energized for the fifth grade rock show!

Stage Manager #5: I've got a good cheer to get them ready: GIVE ME AN "F"..."I" ... "F"..."T"...."H"... What does it spell? (Managers #1-#3 do not appreciate what's happening while #4 -#6 join in the cheering)

Stage Manager #1: Hold on a second. (They keep cheering) I don't think you understand what's going on. (cheering continues) Please??? (They STILL keep cheering)

Stage Managers #1, #2, & #3: (Looking at each other) STOP!!!!!

(The CHEERING finally stops)

Stage Manager #2: That's better. First of all, even though our concert is about ROCK STARS - we <u>don't</u> want people to act like they're at a rock concert.

Stage Manager #5: We don't?? Why not?

Stage Manager #3: Well, at a rock concert, people get up and start dancing to songs. But if you stand up, you'll block the people behind you and that is not a "Win-Win".

Stage Manager #1: Also, at a rock concert, people can hoot and holler all they want because the band has amps so big that they're <u>always</u> louder than the crowd.

Stage Manager #4: Oh. (looks disappointed) But how will the singers know the crowd likes them without all the cheers?

Stage Manager #3: If everyone applauds respectfully, I think we'll all catch on that we're appreciated. UNDERSTAND?? (She is looking at the ROWDY Stage Managers)

Stage Managers #4, #5, & #6: (sighing) I guess so.

Stage Manager #1: Good! All right everyone, it's time to get ready for the show. (All the stage managers leave, but Speakers #1, #2, #3, #4 come up to mics)

Speaker #1: Alright everybody, let's try this again. Welcome to our 5th grade concert; "Highway U.S.A."

Speaker #2: Today, we will be taking a <u>musical</u> tour of the good of USA.

Speaker #1: You may ask why we are taking this tour?

Speaker #2: That's simple, it's what ROCK STARS do and...

BOTH Speakers: ... we just wanna be ROCK STARS!

Speaker #3: (looking to make sure that Speakers #1 & #2 have gone back to their spots and turning to talk with Speaker #4) *So, what do you think about that?*

Speaker #4: Everything they said made sense, but I'm kinda bummed.

Speaker #3: Me too. There should be a way we can be respectful & still have "rock star" fun.

Speaker #4: That's right and we have a plan...

Speaker #3: On the final song today...

Speaker #4: which is "We Are the Champions"...

Speaker #3: we're gonna ask you all to turn the flashlights on your cell phones.

Speaker #4: If you watch us, we'll show you when to wave your phones in time with the music.

Speaker #3: And with that, our concert begins...

Speaker #4:with the song "I Just Wanna be a Rock Star!"

SONG - "Rockstar"

<u>Scene 1-</u>

Speaker #5: It's time to start our tour. As you look at your programs, you'll see some very unusual song titles.

Speaker #6: (looking at the program) *Song titles? They look like blank lines to me.*

Speaker #7: That's because we are presenting you with a combination concert and TRIVIA night!

Speaker #6: A combination concert and TRIVIA night???

Speaker #7: Dude, that's what (s)he just said.

Speaker #5: Each song we sing represents a place we visit on our tour. We'll give you clues for each place we visit BEFORE we sing the song.

Speaker #6: Ohhhh, I think I get it now. After we give the clues, the audience members write down their guesses about where we're going.

Speaker #7: How will they know if they've guessed the right answer?

Speaker #5: That's simple, they'll listen to the lyrics of the song!

Speaker #6: Cool!! It's kinda like a quiz. Ha ha ha - (points to parents) Let's see how YOU like taking quizzes?

Speaker #5: Calm down, dude! Of course it's just for fun.

Speaker #7: Right. And ... at the end of the concert, see how many you got right.

Speaker #6: Will there be prizes?

Speaker #5: Actually, there will be prizes for <u>all</u> the participants.

Speaker #6: I really hope I win!

Speaker #7: Dude, you can't play.

Speaker #6: Oh yeah? Why not?

Speaker #5: Cause you already know all the songs...

Speaker #6: Riiiiigghhht.

Speaker #7: And on that note, it's time for your first clue followed by

our next song. (Speakers #5, #6, #7 join the choir)

Speaker #8: The first stop on our tour is a midwestern city, just like ours!

- **Speaker #9:** The state name is in the title of the song.
- **Speaker #8:** This state is home to 3 famous kinds of food:
- Speaker #9: WONDER bread
- Speaker #8: Orville Redenbacher Popcorn....
- Speaker #9: ...and Van Camps Baked Beans!!!
- Speaker #8: Eh, 2 out of 3 ain't bad?
- **Speaker #9:** The city in this song is famous for its steel mills...

Speaker #8: ... and it is the birthplace of the Jackson 5.

Speaker #9: This city was made famous in a musical about a traveling salesman.

Speaker #8: And with that clue, it's time to write your guess down. I'm curious as to HOOSIER GUESS???

(make it sound like "Who's your?" - Indiana is known as the "Hoosier" State)

Speaker #9: Good luck with your quiz!

SONG - "Gary, Indiana"

<u>Scene 2-</u>

Speaker #10: Hey folks, we're gonna head down South for our next song.

Speaker #11: And the next stop on our tour is actually <u>not</u> a city but a barren summit in the Great Smoky mountains.

Speaker #12: A barren summit? What's that?

Speaker #10: (5)he means a mountain without plants, just dirt - a barren summit.

Speaker #12: Ohhhh. That doesn't sound very appealing. Tell me more.

Speaker #11: This song is comes from a state that has TEN official state songs...

Speaker #10: And our song is one of these!

Speaker #12: Cool! Can you give us another hint??

Speaker #11: Okay. This song is always played at football games at this state's university...

Speaker #10: When their team wins, the quarterback gets to direct the band while they play this song.

Speaker #11: And the most famous quarterback from this university is the great Peyton Manning!

Speaker #12: You mean the guy from the <u>Nationwide commercials</u>? Awesome!

Speaker #10: And here is your final clue: this sad song is a lament from a city dweller..

Speaker #11: Who wishes they could live out in the country again.

Speaker #12: On a barren summit? Who would VOLUNTEER to go there?

Speaker #11: Lots of people, I guess. (whispers to audience) By the way, the word "Volunteer" is a hint. (Tennessee is known as the "Volunteer" State)

Speaker #12: (turning to the audience) Well good luck with those clues, folks!

Speaker #10: I think that our song will be the best clue of all, so listen carefully

SONG - "Rocky Top"

<u>Scene 3-</u>

Speaker #13: Our next clue features a mash-up of 2 songs.

Speaker #14: And these 2 songs are about 2 fine states with similar names.

Speaker #15: One of these songs is 100 years old!

Speaker #13: The other song first became popular in 1968.

Speaker #14: The 2 states we'll sing about have nicknames too.

Speaker #15: One was called the "Tar Heel State" or the "Old <u>North</u> State".

Speaker #13: And that's a pretty significant hint!

Speaker #14: The other is now called the "Palmetto State" although it was previously known as the "Rice State", the "Swamp State" and... the "Iodine State".

Speaker #15: The IODINE state? That nasty orange medicine??? What???

Speaker #13: Hey, I'm just reading my part - I didn't make up that name.

Speaker #14: One last clue - one of these states is considered "First in Flight".

Speaker #15: Nothing could be finer than to travel to these southern states!

SONG - "Going to Carolina in my Mind" & "Nothing could be Finer than to be in Carolina"

<u>Scene 4-</u>

Speaker #16: Before we head to our next tour stop - we have some great clues for you!

Speaker #17: Yee-hah! This state is known for 3 firsts.

Speaker #18: Here we go, listen up!

Speaker #16: Clue number 1: it was the site of the <u>first</u> rodeo in the world.

Speaker #17: Clue number 2: jalapeno jelly <u>first</u> originated in this state.

Speaker #18: AND ... Clue number 3: this state is the <u>first</u> to have 2 official state animals!

Speaker #16: The first is called the longhorn and you might recognize this hand signal.

(the hand signal for "Longhorn" is touching your ring & tall finger to thumb, put up pointer & pinky the hand signal is used at Texas sports games)

Speaker #17: The second is the armadillo and it's hand signal is (attempts to make a hand signal that looks like an armadillo) Actually, there is no hand signal for that animal.

Speaker #18: No kidding... they're kinda funny looking critters.

Speaker #16: We have a feeling those weren't the best clues. So, here's 3 more: this state was ruled over by 6 different nations.

Speaker #17: This is our second largest state as well.

Speaker #18: And... it's economy is the 10th largest in the world!!

Speaker #16: But the best part is, y'all get to clap along with us on this song!

Speakers #17 & #18: Yeee-hah!!

SONG - "Deep in the Heart of Texas"

<u>Scene 5-</u>

Speaker #19: I'm having second thoughts about visiting this next state.

Speaker #20: Oh yeah, why is that?

Speaker #21: Well, we did our homework and we found out that this state has the most tornadoes per square mile of all 50 states.

Speaker #20: Oh dear. Maybe we should just go somewhere else instead.

Speaker #19: Now hold on a second. We also discovered some really cool things about this state.

Speaker #21: For example, this state has some very UNUSUAL laws.

Speaker #20: Come on....how unusual could laws be?

Speaker #19: Well, for example - It's against the law to carry a fishbowl - with live fish - on a bus there.

Speaker #20: I guess that makes sense, the police might not know if you stole that fish, right?

Speaker #21: Really? Well, I heard that it's unlawful to make an ugly face at a dog in this state. What do you think of that?

Speaker #20: Hey, dogs have rights too! Those 2 laws make total sense to me.

Speaker #19: Well, listen to this law. It is against the law to take a bite out of another person's hamburger there.

Speaker #20: You've got to be kidding me! That's just horrible.

Speaker #21: No word of a lie.

Speaker #19: (Talking to the audience) One last thing, you can earn bonus points on this song!

Speaker #21: And all you have to do is guess the name of a musical about this state!

Speaker #20: (Turning to speak to Speakers #19 & 21) Hey guys, Are you sure it's <u>not</u> against the law to play trivia games there?

SONG - "Oklahoma"

Scene 6-

DJ Happy Tappy: Aloha Dragons! I'm DJ Happy Tappy Too!

DJ Happy Helner: And I'm DJ Happy Helner and it's time for the

Both DJ's: Winchester Trivia Happy Hour!

DJ Happy Tappy: During our Trivia Happy Hour, we pick 3 contestants from the choir behind us.

DJ Happy Helner: And they will help <u>all of you</u> figure out the title to our next song.

DJ Tappy: So let's get started. Contestant Number 1. Our next song involves an activity which takes place on water - what do you think it might be?

Contestant #1: That's easy; photography.

DJ Tappy: Uh....no. Contestant Number 2 - what it your answer?

DJ Tappy: Folks, now it's time for our lightning round. You each get 1 final question. Contestant #1, this song is a blast from the past, made popular in the Sixties. This song was sung by a pair of brothers from the West coast and their friends. Do you know the name of the band?

Contestant #1: That's easy; nope.

DJ Tappy: Uh....nice try?

DJ Helner: Contestant #2, here's your question: this song comes from the state with the most beaches on the Pacific ocean. Can you guess the name of the state?

Contestant #2: Is it Idaho?

DJ Helner: Wow... your answer is a little scary. Do they teach geography at your school?

DJ Tappy: Time for our final question. Contestant #3, what sport involves the terms "Cowabunga" and "hang 10"?

Contestant #3: Let me think, tropical weather- on the water - "cowabunga" and "hang 10 I've got it! It must be WATER POLO.

Speaker #23: And the title of this song will remind you of a large fruit, like an apple.

Speaker #24: This song is so popular, it's heard at sporting events, parades, even at really big New Year's Eve celebrations.

Speaker #22: It's also the theme song of the baseball team we all love to hate... the Yankees.

Speaker #23: You'll get to hear this song and see the famous Winchester Dragon Dancers.

Speaker #24: So go ahead everybody, Name that TUNE!

SONG - "New York, New York!"

<u>Scene 8-</u>

Speaker #25: We won't be feeling blue when we visit this next place but we **will** be singing the blues.

Speaker #26: So true. This song was written back in 1936 by guitarist Robert Johnson.

Speaker #27: But then it was made popular again in the 1980's by some BLUES brothers named Jake and Elwood.

Speaker #28: Who were played by 2 original cast members of the TV show: Saturday Night Live.

Speaker #25: Named John Belushi and Dan Akroyd.

Speaker #26: The song is based on a Midwestern city where two of their professional sports teams are named after a parent animal and it's baby.

Speaker #27: Huh? What are you talking about?

Speaker #28: Well, what do you call a baby BEAR?

Speaker #27: A CUB....Oh, I get it!

Speaker #25: And one of their sports team is named after a flying bird of prey.

Speaker #26: And another is named after a RAGING animal.

Speaker #28: Well guys, it's time to head to our next destination.

Speaker #25: And if it gets WINDY, we should be there really soon!

Speaker #26: I hope you've got your WHITE sox on, cause here we go. SWEET!!

SONG - "Sweet Home, Chicago"

Speaker #29: And now it's time for our final stop & I've gotta tell you...it's my favorite!

Speaker #30: *Me too!* This state is known for having the longest freshwater coastline of any state in the country.

Speaker #31: It was the first place to establish a state university.

Speaker #32: And the original name of that university was Cathelpistemian.

Speaker #33: Yikes! That's a mouthful!

Speaker #32: You betcha! It sure is a lot easier just to say, "Go Blue!"

Speaker #29: It was the first state to provide for public libraries..

Speaker #30: And a public HIGH School education for all its citizens.

Speaker #31: And the food in this state is delicious!

Speaker #32: Where else could you have something as healthy as cherries or apples...

Speaker #33: Or as delicious as a hot fudge cream puff.

Speaker #29: The coney dog originated in this state.

Speaker #30: And the fudge here is fantastic!!

Speaker #31: It's the home of pasties and paczis!

Speaker #32: And also the home of Faygos and autos.

Speaker #33: Autos aren't food?

Speaker #29: I know, but this state is known for them and they sorta rhyme; you know Faygos....Autos....

Speaker #30: Hmmmm. Another soda that got its start here is the best ginger ale in the world: Vernors!

<u>Scene 10-</u>

Speaker #34: WE did it! We finished our tour!

Speaker #35: And we hope that you've finished your quizzes.

Speaker #36: Time to tally up your answers. (Jeopardy theme song is played)

Speaker #37: How did you do? How many of you guessed all nine of our tour stops correctly? Don't be shy, raise your hands. You just earned an A!

Speaker #38: Did any of you get 7 or 8 correct? That would be a B+!!

Speaker #34: 5 correct would be a B, anyone? I guess 3 or 4 would be a C.

Speaker #35: Did everyone get at least <u>one</u> answer correct??? I sure hope you all got the Michigan one right.

Speaker #36: Well folks, here's what we've decided: anyone who got at least 1 correct answer is a <u>winner!</u>

Speaker #37: And every winner gets ... a PRIZE!!

Speaker #38: AND your prize is..., you get to take a fifth grader home with you!! BEST PRIZE EVER!!!!

Speaker #34: Our last number is actually 2 songs that are traditionally sung together.

Speaker #35: And on the FINAL song, it's your turn to be Rock 'n Roll stars.
