LEARNING FOCUS: The Alphabet AND the Music Alphabet

Materials: Computer Rhythm Instrument (could be 2 wooden spoons)

Activity:

- 1. Today, you'll be learning about the Alphabet through songs & movement.
- 2. Start with the traditional version of the Alphabet song: <u>Traditional Alphabet Song</u> See if you can use your instrument to play the rhythm of the words. Then, Move to this version of the "Alphabet Song": <u>ABC Dance</u>
- 3. Now you can learn to say and SIGN the alphabet song using ASL; American Sign Language: Alphabet in ASL
- 4. See if you can SING the alphabet song with ASL: <u>ASL Alphabet Song | Slow ABC Song (song only)</u>
- 5. The Music Alphabet is a little different. Can you sing the "Music Alphabet Song" to the tune of the Traditional Alphabet song? Then challenge yourself to sing the "Music Alphabet" backwards!?

EXTENSION: Can you fill in the letters of the Music Alphabet on the picture of the keyboard on the next page?

Here is one last Alphabet Song, You can sing it to your family, OR...try singing it with ASL!

"A, you're Adorable": A YOU'RE ADORABLE

Let's hear the same song from Sesame Street:

Sesame Street - A, You're Adorable

MUSIC ALPHABET

A - B - C - D - E - F - G!

The music alphabet ends at G.

The music alphabet ends at G.


I can sing it the backwards way.


There are 7 piano keys;
